- Working Definition
 - + Schooling or Education is to develop an individual

 - If an individual is made of many dimensions including: spiritual, intellectual, social, emotional, and physical; then, one could conclude school to be a place where these all have a place.
 - This is where the history of Christian Education, as far as the Christian School Movement, begins

3. CHRISTIAN SCHOOL MOVEMENT AND MANDATES

Christian School Movement

- + Dissatisfied with common practice
- + Need for strengthening the Church
- + Rooted in discipleship
- + Fairly young movement gained momentum in the 1970's

3. CHRISTIAN SCHOOL MOVEMENT AND MANDATES

- Christian School Mandates
 - + Christian in nature
 - + Unified with home and church
 - + Disciple the youth
 - ★ Discipleship = one in position of <u>disciple</u>
 - Disciple = one who follows and embraces and assists in spreading the teachings of another

Brief Background

- Two main philosophical approaches
 - + Outreach Christian Schools
 - × Also, referred to as "open"
 - + Discipleship Christian Schools
 - × Also, referred to as "closed"

4. APPROACHES TO CHRISTIAN ED.

- Outreach Christian Schools
 - + Typically characterized as a Christian school in which neither parents nor students have to profess to be a follower of Jesus Christ.
 - + Usually, it is the aim of the leadership in these schools that students would come to know Jesus as their Savior through the ministry of the school, whether by, administration, teacher, or student.

4. APPROACHES TO CHRISTIAN ED.

- Discipleship Christian Schools
 - + Typically characterized as a Christian school in which at least one or both parents must profess Jesus as Lord, and also, students at a set age(age of accountability) will have professed Christ as Savior.
 - + Usually, the aim of leadership is to assist the church in partnering with parents to train their children in the ways of the Lord.

5. DISTINCTIVES OF DISCIPLESHIP CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

 - + Christian Personnel
 - + Christian Partners
 - + Seeker Students
 - + Unity with churches

 - + Effective Service
